Gen: responsive w/o → in obvious respiratory distress and pain; moving all extremities.

Integument: remarkable for 1.1 cm entry wound @ post axillary line 4th intercostal space. Some mottling of skin of ~~extremities~~ extremities.

Lymph Nodes: No palpable lymphadenopathy

HEENT: head normocephalic, no evidence of laceration, tenderness, PERLA, full EOM, blood in mouth and back of throat. Tr's clear no blood or fluid. Neck sup.

Lungs: chest wall stable - entrance wound as above. No breath sounds audible over @ ant./lat. thor. Good breath sounds on @ & wheezing over lung fields. Splinting @ chest

Con: soft S₁/S₂ faint, sub. gallop. 2+/4 JVD. PMI not palpable.

Abd: ↓d bowel sounds, flat soft, nontender.

Back: No additional entry sites, no ecchymoses, no crepitation.

Genitalia: ul @ → genitalia - post ure. - no scrotal edema, 5 mm.

Extremities: pale, full ROM, no edema, nontender.

Neurological: alert, oriented x3
CN II-VII intact
sens/motor/fingerbellows grossly intact
DTR's 2+/4 bilat. @ Babinski

Rectal: deferred to O.R.

Chest tubes - 900cc blood out on placement - 200cc/hr subsequently.
